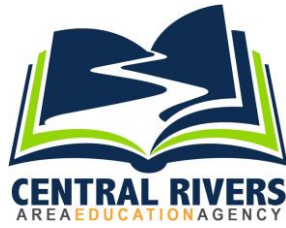


Family & Educator Partnership



What is the Family and Educator Partnership:

Central Rivers AEA Family & Educator Partnership is part of the Iowa Family & Educator Partnership, a statewide network of families and educators working together to develop and sustain effective partnerships between families, educators and community providers to promote success for all children and youth with disabilities.

The Family & Educator Partnership program (FEP) is sponsored by the Iowa Department of Education's Bureau of Learner Strategies and Supports. It was founded in 1984 to provide parents and educators with opportunities to work together in positive ways to improve educational programs for children and young adults with disabilities.

The program is founded on the principals that:

- Families, educators and community providers all have important roles, responsibilities and perspectives in the education and support of children.
- Two-way frequent and meaningful communication builds successful partnerships
- In successful partnerships families, educators and community providers work together by recognizing, understanding and respecting individual differences, cultural backgrounds and differing opinions and seek solutions.
- Building partnerships among families, educators and community providers as early as possible enhances the degree of family and child success.
- Each family determines their level of participation in system processes

Services for Many

The Family & Educator Partnership serves anyone involved with a child who has special needs. This may include parents, grandparents, foster parents, caregivers, teachers, guidance counselors, school administrators, AEA staff, siblings and community service providers.

Support

The program offers support to families and schools as they work together to create, promote and sustain systems of family engagement in our schools and communities.



Direct Support

The Family & Educator Partnership helps parents and educators by:

- Answering questions either by phone, e-mail or in person
- Referring to other resources
- Assisting with the communication process between families and schools

Support of the IEP/IFSP Process

Family & Educator Partnership supports home and school communication in a variety of ways, including providing support to families so they can more effectively participate in the IFSP (Individual Family Service Plan) or IEP (Individualized Education Program) process, including:

- Information about the IEP/IFSP process,
- Review of procedural safeguards,
- Help prepare for a meeting. or
- Attend IEP/IFSP or other school meetings as requested by the local school, AE staff or parents

Transition Assistance

The Family & Educator Partnership places special emphasis on the important transition stages in a child's education. The FEP may support transition planning by:

- Helping a family develop a vision for the student's future,
- Providing workshops on transition related topics,
- Sharing information about community resources, or
- Collaborating with other agencies on family support and transition related issues
